Jubilee Year Indulgence

During the great Jubilee of Mercy, a plenary indulgence may be obtained by making pilgrimage to one of the great papal basilicas in Rome and passing through its Holy Door and fulfilling the spiritual requirements of this exercise. This indulgence is also granted to those who fulfill the same exercise by making pilgrimage to the Door of Mercy opened in the cathedral or other designated church in a diocese. It is the Holy Father's great desire that the gateway of divine mercy be opened up to everyone. ****It is to be noted** that the obtaining of the Jubilee Year Indulgence is granted only to those who make a pilgrimage to either Holy Rosary Cathedral, Regina or Our Lady of the Assumption Co-cathedral, Gravelbourg and fulfill the requirements of the pious exercise.



Indulgences - General Conditions

The following general remarks on Indulgences summarizes the usual conditions given in the Church's law:

1. This is how an indulgence is defined in the Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 1471): An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. An indulgence is partial or plenary according as it removes either part or all of the temporal punishment due to sin. The faithful can gain indulgences for themselves or apply them to the dead.

2. In general, the gaining of indulgences requires certain *prescribed conditions* (below, nos. 3, 4), and the performance of certain prescribed works

3. To gain indulgences, whether plenary or partial, it is necessary that the faithful be in the *state of grace* at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed.

4. A *plenary indulgence* can be gained only *once a day*. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace:

—have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin; —have sacramentally confessed their sins; — receive the Holy Eucharist —pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

5. It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act. Prayer for the Pope's intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an "Our Father" and a "Hail Mary" are suggested. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence.

6. For the sake of those legitimately impeded, *confessors* can commute both the work prescribed and the conditions required (except, obviously, detachment from even venial sin).

7. Indulgences *can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased*, but they cannot be applied to other persons living on earth.
