Offering of the Mass



By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church).

This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses are requested through the parish office.

Feast of Our Lady of Peñafrancia and Divino Rostro



Little Flower Parish invites everyone to join us in celebrating the Feast of Our Lady of Peñafrancia and the Divino Rostro on **Saturday, September 19.**

The devotion to Our Lady of Peñafrancia has its roots in Salamanca, Spain, where devotion to the Virgin of Peña de Francia began centuries ago. In 1710, the devotion was brought to Naga City in the Philippines and has since grown into one of the largest Marian devotions in the country.

Each year, thousands of devotees gather in Naga City to honor Our Lady and ask for her prayers and intercession. Our Lady of Peñafrancia is lovingly called "Ina," meaning "Mother," and is honored as the Patroness of Bicol.

The devotion to the Divino Rostro (Holy Face) became closely connected with Our Lady of Peñafrancia in the late 19th century, and the two are now honored together during the Peñafrancia festivities.

Mass will be at 11:00am, followed by a potluck at Little Flower Hall. Please bring a dish to share and join us for fellowship.

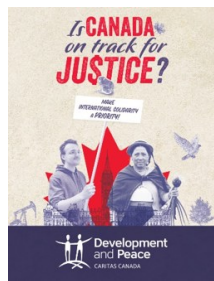
