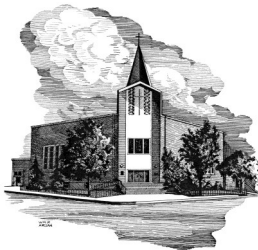

Fifth Sunday of Easter



As we celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Easter, we continue to grow in the light and hope of the Resurrection. In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us of the importance of remaining in His love, just as branches remain connected to the vine to bear fruit. This powerful image calls us to stay rooted in Him, drawing strength and grace from His presence in our lives. When we remain close to Christ, our actions begin to reflect His love, patience, and compassion. This Sunday invites us to deepen our relationship with Him, to trust in His life-giving presence, and to live in a way that bears good fruit for others. Guided by His love, we are encouraged to be signs of peace, kindness, and faith in the world around us.

Offering of the Mass



By virtue of the “communion of saints,” the Church commends the dead to God’s mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses are requested through the parish office.
