St. Thérèse



St. Thérèse of Lisieux was a Carmelite nun whose service to her order, although seemingly unremarkable, was later recognized for its spiritual accomplishments. She is a patron saint of missionaries, florists, pilots and priests. She is also invoked on behalf of the sick. She was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1925, and was named a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997. St. Therese is the youngest person to be designated a Doctor of the Church, and is one of only four women.

St. Thérèse said: “Remember that nothing is small in the eyes of God.”

Offering of the Mass

 By virtue of the “communion of saints,” the Church commends the dead to God’s mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses are requested through the parish office.

Pro Life News



A few years ago, in the province of British Columbia, the government withdrew funding from the Delta Hospice Society over its refusal to offer assisted suicide (MAiD) as part of the palliative care it provided to patients. Currently, a group, Dying With Dignity, is using the courts to intervene and force a Catholic hospital in Vancouver to provide suicide as treatment to patients.

St. Paul's Hospital is operated by Providence Health Care Society, which describes itself as a Catholic health care community dedicated to meeting the physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs of those served. The court action maintains that St. Paul's willingness to provide information about MAiD, and to transfer MAiD-seeking patients to other facilities, is not an acceptable compromise. The goal here is coercion, not autonomy or choice for patients or the religious institutions serving patients.

*The implication here: If St. Paul's Hospital loses the court case, all religious institutions that are funded by governments across Canada may be impacted.
