



St. Thérèse



St. Thérèse's parents were considered to be ordinary people who were devoted to their family. They both shared a deep connection to their faith. At twenty-two, young Louis sought to enter religious life at the monastery of the Augustinian Canons of the Great St. Bernard Hospice in the Alps. He became ill and

dispirited, and abandoned his hopes for the monastic life. As a young lady, Zelie sought unsuccessfully to enter the religious order of the Sisters of the Hotel-Dieu. Louis Martin and Zelie Guerin eventually met in Alencon, and on July 13, 1858, Louis, 34, and Zelie, 26, married and began their remarkable voyage through life.

St. Thérèse said: "The value of life does not depend upon the place we occupy. It depends upon the way we occupy that place."

Offering of the Mass



By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back

as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses are requested through the parish office.

PRO-LIFE NEWS



The Liberal Government recently awarded over \$4.3 million in funding to researchers at the University of British Columbia Faculty of Medicine to promote abortion to minorities as part of over \$13 million in funding for pro-

abortion groups under the "Sexual and Reproductive Health Fund".

According to UBC Medicine, the taxpayer dollars will fund research "to address barriers to abortion access for underserved populations." The group (UBC Contraception and Abortion Research Team) promised it would push abortion on minority and marginalized groups including migrants, Indigenous and other racial minorities, and disabled women.
