Land Acknowledgement





Zagime Anishinabek First Nation is a Saulteaux (Nakawe) band formally known as Sakimay First Nation is located 16 kms northeast of Grenfell, Sask. With approximately 1400 members who live on and off reserve. Chief Sah-kee-may signed Treaty 4 on September 15, 1974. The people were known as the "Goose Lake People". Zagime Anishinabek (https://zagime.ca/about/) is a combination of Zagime, Shesheep Minoahchak, and Little Bone bands occupying the north and south side of Crooked Lake. Chief Lynn Acoose

(https://www.cbc.ca/news/canada/saskatoon/sakimay-first-nation-zagime-anishinabek-1.5295942) reclaimed its original name Zagime Anishinabek First Nation, which was incorrectly named Sakimay, an error that took more than a century to correct.

It would be nice never to have to pay taxes. In today's gospel reading, The Pharisees tried to use this tactic to put Jesus at odds with the government. However, Jesus instructs us that there are needs in the world, both temporal and spiritual. This remains true for everyone. A person must ensure that they are financially responsible and contribute in their own way to the development of the state and government, but also be aware of the spiritual life and give God appropriate devotion and worship to avoid extremism in either direction. Isaiah speaks of how God can work through the government, shown through this address to King Cyrus of Persia, showing the sovereignty of God in the unknowing Cyrus through the return of the Jewish people from their Babylonian exile. By contributing to the Archbishop's Appeal, you keep the Church a voice of goodness, truth, and beauty in a society that often forgets the spiritual realities and dignity of the human person. On this World Mission Sunday, consider the words of Pope Francis: "How I long to find the right words to stir up enthusiasm for a new chapter of evangelization full of zeal, joy, generosity, courage, boundless love, and attraction! Yet I realize that no words of encouragement will be enough unless the fire of the Holy Spirit burns in our hearts. A spiritfilled evangelization is guided by the Holy Spirit, for he is the soul of the Church called to proclaim the Gospel."

Through the Archbishop's Appeal, youth and young adults of our diocese would continue to have encounters of faith, continually growing in their faith and love for the Church.
