

Offering of the Mass

By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making an atonement so that they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses may be requested through the parish office.

If you wish to have the Mass offered on a specific date, please make arrangements at least one month in advance.

Dear Little Flower Parishioners,

Over the past year, Archbishop Don has been inviting all parishes in the archdiocese to consider who they need to be in dialogue with. Many of the parishes throughout the archdiocese have been challenged, both pre-and post-Covid, by declining attendance and parishioner engagement, lower collections and donations, and aging buildings. Several parishes in our diocese are having conversations with other Catholic parishes, with partners from other Christian denominations, and with towns and RMs in small communities.

About nine months ago, Bishop Don asked the priests assigned to St. Mary’s, Holy Cross, and Little Flower to speak with their pastoral council leadership about entering into exploratory discussions with the other two parishes. Approximately five months ago, representatives from the diocesan leadership met with each of the three pastoral councils to review Bishop Don’s request and asked that each of the three parishes appoint representatives to enter into exploratory discussions. Representatives of the parish councils of the three parishes, along with the parish priests, have met with each other a few times now. The discussions are entered into in good faith and without any predetermined outcome. No decisions have been made.

The encouragement that has been provided is to work towards having parishes that are not only viable but also vibrant and vital to the community. When the initial conversations between the leaders of our three parishes move beyond exploratory dialogue to any type of discernment phase, information will be communicated fully with all parishioners.

Please keep the initial discussions in prayer.

Bulletin Reflection:

Exodus 22:21-27 | 1Thess. 1:5c-10 | Matt. 22:34-40

The theme of this Sunday's readings is love. Jesus reminds us that the most important duty of a Christian is to love the Lord with our whole self and to also love our neighbor as our self.

But love of neighbor is not always an easy task, especially when we recognize that others don't always treat us with that sense of selfless love and, in fact, can be downright cruel to us at times. Nonetheless, Christ's law of love stands firm. We are to love. Always!

Jesus offers us the perfect example of selfless love on the cross in amends for our sins. He gave his life so that we could enjoy everlasting life. The stewardship way of life calls us to follow Jesus' example and act on this selfless love. By doing so, we set an example and call others to follow Christ.

Saskatchewan Provincial Election



The organization Catholic Conscience - is working with Catholic dioceses across the province to offer information and resources during the Saskatchewan provincial election. The Catholic Action campaign is a non-partisan voter education initiative, centered on educating Catholic voters about Catholic social teaching and how that teaching relates to relevant political issues; along with mobilizing the Catholic community to get out and vote. The first Catholic Action campaign was held during the 2019 federal election, and included a range of resource materials such as "Conscience Cards," one-page briefs on themes of Catholic social teaching and its relation to relevant election issues, and party platform comparisons from the perspective of Catholic teaching. Catholic Conscience's latest Catholic Action campaign will help Saskatchewan Catholic voters prayerfully and thoughtfully discern their vote in this provincial election.
