government and the First Nations people of the prairies, neither party negotiated and agreed that residential schools be established. Instead, the First Nations negotiated for schools on their reserves where their languages and cultures were the main components of the curriculum along with learning the English language and math so that their children could work alongside the newcomers and their children.
