Did you know... Muscowpetung Saulteaux First Nation is a Saulteaux nation located in the beautiful Qu'Appelle Valley near Edenwold SK and has a population of approximately 1600 members who reside on and off reserve. Chief Cheekuk signed an adhesion to Treaty 4 on September 8, 1875. In 2021, the community began the Muscowpetung Powwow Arbour project and worked with a team from Oxbow Architecture Inc. to design the arbour with a completion date in 2023. A Word About Trauma...

Trauma and associated words are being used more now than ever. Do we know the origins of these words? Are their meanings different now than when they were first used? Each week we will explore a trauma-associated word's origins, meanings and evolution.

Shame: (SHam) Noun A painful feeling of humiliation Verb: - used as an object - to cause or force humiliation. From old English *scamu* or *sceomu* "painful feeling of guilt or disgrace" by C 1300 "modesty, shyness, regard for propriety, or decency" in mid-13c "inflict disgrace or dishonour upon" by 1580s evolved to "thing or person to be ashamed of" Shame can be described as a negative emotion that may involve pervasive and destructive beliefs about yourself and your sense of self, leading to feeling worthless or inferior—trauma and shame or closely linked. Intimate partner violence or childhood abuse or neglect, and sexual violence are associated with greater feelings of shame.

Lesson Eighteen

FAQ: Does the Catechism remove the content of faith too much from the lived Christian life?

The largest portion of the Catechism treats the content of the faith (Book One), but the second largest treats the moral life (Book Three). The relationship between what one believes and how one behaves on account of that belief is clear in the Catechism. It is evident in the sections on social teachings. Faith is presented as more than the systematic knowledge of doctrine. Each section of the Catechism should be read in light of the whole, and the relationship between faith and life needs to be demonstrated continually so that the transforming power of the Christian message might be evident.
