Offering of the Mass

When you become eligible to receive the vaccine, you may register online or by phone. The Saskatchewan Health Authority website will have the current info on who is eligible to book their vaccine; please check their site at <u>https://www.saskhealthauthority.ca</u>/ before trying to book your appointment.

When booking an appointment for vaccination, please keep the following in mind:

Telephone booking is for use only by those currently eligible to receive the vaccine.

For all other COVID or vaccine related inquires, you are asked to use $\underline{811}$. Once you become eligible, you will remain eligible even after other age groups open up.

When the time comes for you book your appointment, please have the following on hand:

Saskatchewan health card, Cell phone number or Email address.

Confirmation of booking will be sent by text or email; you will also receive a notification 24 hours before your appointment. If your appointment time changes, you will also be notified. During the booking process, you will have the opportunity to select a vaccination clinic closest to you. Please Note: The AstraZeneca vaccine is also available immediately for 60 to 64 year-olds at the Regina Drive-Thru immunization clinic on the grounds of the Regina Exhibition Association Ltd. This is on a first-come, first-serve basis.
