Green Ribbon Sunday

Regina Pro-Life is sponsoring the Green Ribbon Campaign to remember our preborn brothers and sisters who have been denied life. On January, 28, 1988, the Supreme Court of Canada issued the Morgentaler

decision, which struck down abortion as part of the criminal code. Since then, there have been no laws to regulate abortion in Canada through all 9 months of pregnancy. Please wear your green ribbon on January 28th, to remember the millions of Canadians, who have lost their lives to abortion. We specifically ask that you pray for the preborn and for women in crisis pregnancies, seeking abortion. Each year, approximately 2,000 abortions are performed in Saskatchewan hospitals. You can pick up a green ribbon on your way out of the service this weekend on the table at the back of the Church.
