

Return to Vibrancy Announcement:



Our Patron Saint, Thérèse of Lisieux, elaborated a highly original and powerful spirituality, called the "theology of the little way". This spirituality bases the practice of love for God not on great actions, but in everyday - seemingly insignificant - acts. In her autobiography, Thérèse writes, "I want to teach the little methods that have worked for me." By actively participating in renewing the vibrancy of Little Flower Parish, we each have the opportunity to express our love for God in "little ways".

Offering of the Mass



By virtue of the "communion of saints," the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf. (Catechism of the Catholic Church). This practice dates as far back as Judas collecting a sin-offering for the dead, making atonement so they might be delivered from their sin. (2 Maccabees 12:39-45). Masses may also be offered for the intentions of the living or in thanksgiving. Masses are requested through the parish office.

“He said to them, ‘The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few...’” Luke 10:2

Parish office closed




The parish office will be closed on the upcoming Monday, July 3rd. We will resume our services on Tuesday, July 4th. We appreciate your understanding .

Did you know... The Key First Nation is a Nahkawe (Saulteaux) band located 15 kms south of Norquay with a population of approximately 1500 members who reside on and off reserve. Chief Ow-tah-pee-ka-kaw (He who Unlocks or The Key) signed an adhesion to Treaty four on September 24, 1875. In 1954, Gwen O'Soup was elected chief, the first Indigenous woman in Canada to hold this position. Due to federal and provincial government policies on child welfare, many children were taken away from their families and placed in non-Indigenous foster homes where these children experienced physical and sexual abuse and other abuses. The Key Nation is addressing the systemic failure in child welfare <https://www.cbc.ca/news/canada/british-columbia/saskatchewan-key-first-nation-bc-child-welfare-1.6785503> by calling for provincial governments to see Indigenous children placed in Indigenous homes.
